

STREAMING PRO COTIPS

Pro Tip #1: Streaming can save you money.

The best kept secret is finally getting around to people-Streaming can save you money on the TV you want to watch.

For teens, college students, and young adults, streaming has been the perfect fit and budget-friendly option for them. Apps, like **Netflix**, have given them access to a rotating library of shows and movies for \$7.99 or less, and **YouTube** for free.

For some young families with kids, the Disney+ app has been the sole streaming choice. The **Disney**+ Basic Plan for \$9.99/month has been an affordable option, while allowing them to access to an entire collection of content under the Disney umbrella: Disney, Pixar, Marvel, Star Wars, Marvel, National Geographic, and more!

For older adults, retirees, and seniors who've been wanting Live TV (local news, weather, sports, and other favorite channels) without breaking the bank, many have made a choice to switch to streaming with Live TV apps, such as **Hulu + Live TV**, **YouTube TV**, or **Fubo TV**. Plans range from \$72.99-\$94.99 monthly, saving people anywhere from \$20-\$50 per month.

When beginning to stream, there can be an initial investment of some streaming devices which can range \$39.99-\$59.99 for 4k & 4K Max sticks per TV. In Pro Tip #2, we'll explain why.



Pro Tip #2: Smart TVs can be dumb.

For a person looking to buy a TV, it's next to impossible to find a non-Smart TV, as nearly every TV out there is built with smart technology. As tech professionals, we want to share with you that some of the Smart TVs out there are dumb.

Smart TVs come out of the box pre-loaded with some apps. Some of these apps you may want; some you could care less about.

Additionally, Smart TV may not allow you to Add (+) or Download an app that is not in the TV manufacturer's "built-in" app library. This can be frustrating, especially after spending good money on a Smart TV!

To get around this, adding a streaming stick (device) to your Smart TV will allow you to download any app you want.



The moral of this Pro Tip story is..."Some Smart TVs are not as *smart* they as seem." If you're not finding a certain app you want in the collection of apps within your Smart TV, you may need a streaming device to watch the app. And, if the Wi-Fi chip were ever to go out on a Smart TV, know you may still be able to use it, with a streaming stick/device. Hooray!!



Pro Tip #3: There's an app for that.

If you have not yet considered streaming, is it because you are worried you may lose some of your favorite programming or a regional sports channel? It's okay. There are apps for that.

Both ag networks and college sports teams have apps. Some content is free and some may require a paid subscription. Examples... **The Cowboy Channel app** has some FREE Western sports content while **Cowboy Channel+** with subscription offers On Demand library, PLUS Live Events and National Rodeo Finals. **RFD Now app** is much the same. **NSIC Network app (Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference)** is free, airing many regional college sports teams. (nsicnetwork.com) The **Midco Sports Plus** app starts a \$9.99/month, does include The Summit League (Jacks, Bison, & Yotes).

Freevee,The Roku Channel and **YouTube** are Free to watch a nice On Demand library of shows. Zero to extremely little Live weather/news, and it's not local.



On Demand Apps

Not Live from an On Demand Library

Netflix, Disney+, Apple TV+, Hulu (not Live) are apps that allow access to shows and movies from a rotating library, not LIVE. Subscriptions fees are less in cost.


